Located in the nation's capital, Columbian Preparatory School is a private, non-profit, institution designed to prepare young men for college admission. In the more than fifty years of its operation the school has established the reputation of being "The Service-Academy Prep," since many students gain admission to one of the military academies after attending Columbian; however, many students prepare for admission to leading universities as well. A one-year school, Columbian endeavors to develop the "competent scholar," thus preparing each student academically and emotionally.

Concentrated attention is given to mathematics and English—the two most basic subjects which are essential to college success. Athletic and social activities are designed only to maintain that physical health, mental alertness, and emotional balance necessary for effective study. All students must participate in gym classes or intramural sports at least weekly; however, participation in varsity sports is permitted only after parental permission and satisfactory academic work is achieved and maintained.
