

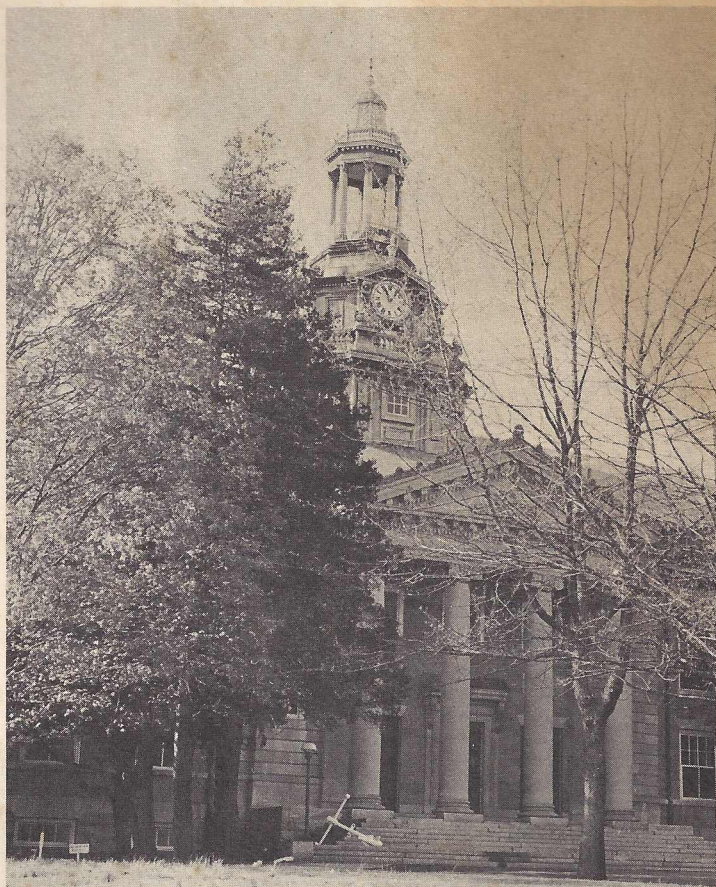

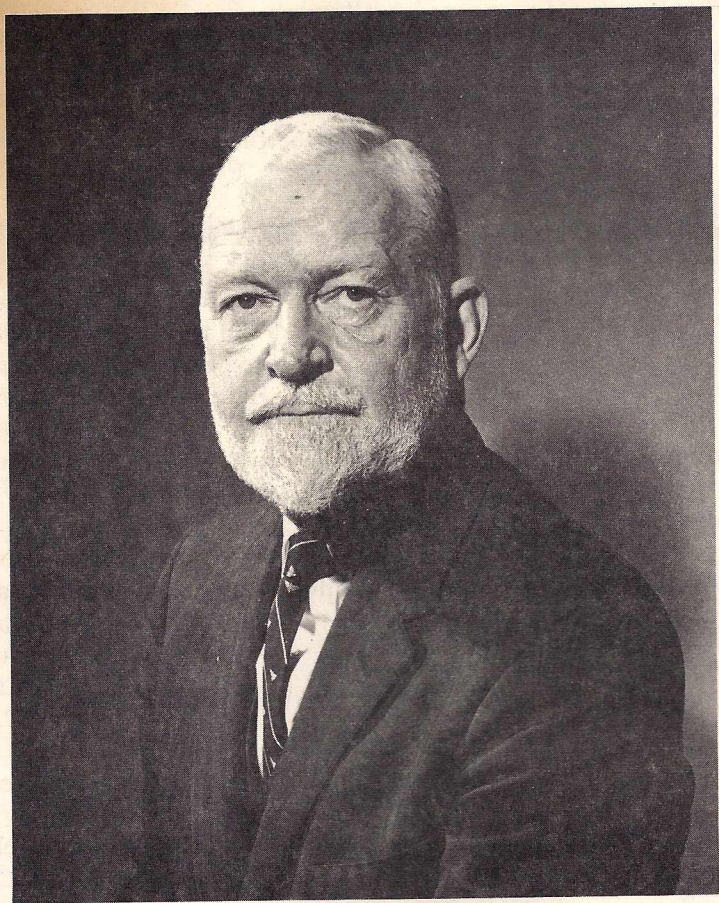

VICE ADMIRAL ROBERT B. PIRIE

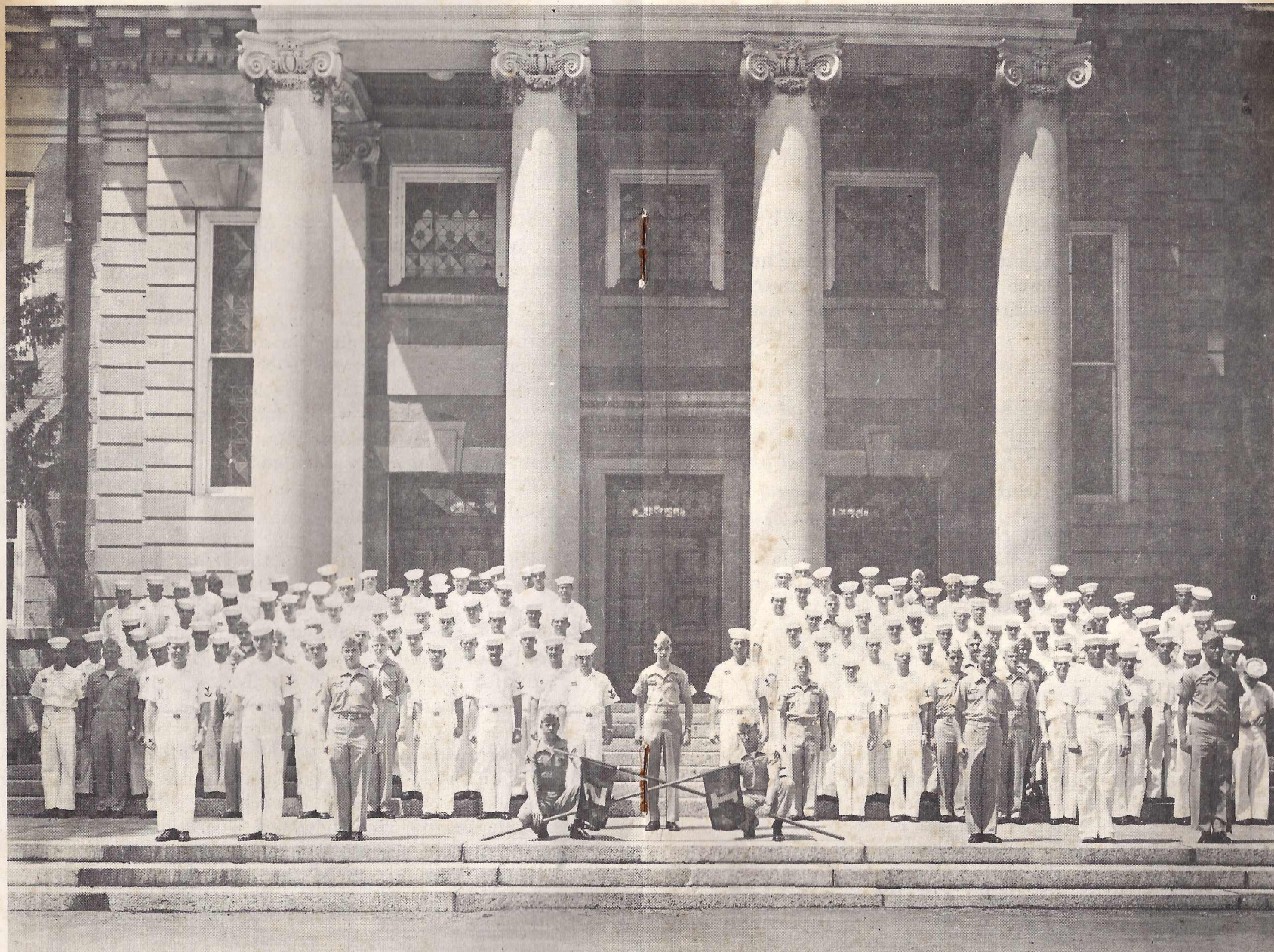
Admiral Pirie's Naval career began in 1922 when he was appointed to the United States Naval Academy from Nebraska. He graduated in June 1924 and was designated a Naval Aviator in 1929.

He served in the carriers LANGLEY, LEXINGTON and YORK-TOWN as a pilot in the 1930's and was a flight test officer at Anacostia 1931-33.

During World War II, he served on the staff of Admiral John H. Towers, commanding Naval Air in the Pacific; as Executive Officer on the USS MISSION BAY in anti-submarine warfare in the Atlantic; and later as Chief of Staff on the staff of Admiral G. F. Bogan and with Admiral Marc Mitscher in Task Force 58 during the Marianas, Saipan, Philippine, Okinawa, Leyte Gulf and China Sea campaigns. At the end of World War II he was Air Operations officer on the staff of COMINCH Fleet Admiral Ernest J. King.

He served as first head of the Department of Aviation at the Naval Academy from January 1946 until March 1948, and returned to the Academy in July 1949 as Commandant of Midshipmen. He was promoted to Rear Admiral while in command of the USS CORAL SEA in 1952. He then served as Chief of Staff for Admiral Jerauld Wright in Europe and as Deputy and Chief of Staff for the U. S. Atlantic Command and Atlantic Fleet. He was also Commander Carrier Division Six in the Mediterranean and in 1957 he was promoted to Vice Admiral in Command of the Second Fleet in the Atlantic and commanded the Allied Striking Fleet in exercise "Strike Back" in 1957. He became Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Air in 1958 and retired from active duty as a Vice Admiral on 1 November 1962 after over forty years of Naval service. He joined the Aerojet-General Corporation at that time as Executive Assitant to the President.

On 1 March 1966, he became an independent consultant to the aerospace industries.
